

### DEMOLITION PERMIT APPLICATION

All building demolition in the City of Gem Lake is subject to first securing a Demolition Permit for each building to be demolished by submitting a completed "Notification of Intent to Perform a Demolition" and a "Pre-Demolition Environmental Checklist and Guide" as supplied by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. Copies of this form are also available from the City of Gem Lake. In addition to the MN/PCA form referenced above, the following information must accompany the MN/PCA form submission:
